(*) – The Palm Sunday Liturgy will begin in the back of the church (depending on the weather, possibly outside in the front of the church) with prayers (including a Gospel reading) before the entrance procession.

When that is concluded, the procession begins and the cantor announces: “The song during the entrance procession is #729 in your hymnals “The King of Glory” #729. Please Stand”.

The singing of “The King of Glory” continues until the procession is completed and the presider has taken his place in the sanctuary.

(**) – The Gospel Reading on Palm Sunday (The Passion of the Lord) will be interspersed with the singing of “Jesus, Remember Me” according to the script which will be provided. For the first time, it should be intoned by the cantor once followed by the congregation singing it once. The second time, it should be sung only once. When the reading of “The Passion of the Lord” is completed, “Jesus, Remember Me” will be repeated three times with each time fading softly away. Like last year, a period of silent reflection will be observed and followed by “Jesus, Remember Me” being sung last time with the presider initiating the singing.
